Consider Him!

- * "He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from Him." Isaiah 53:3 4
- "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you, through His poverty might be made rich." - 2 Corinthians 8:9
- "He was in the world, and the world was made by Him, and the world recognized Him not." - John 1:10

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Despised and Rejected of Men: "a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief ..." - Isaiah 53:3

There has never been anyone as "despised and rejected of men" as Jesus. From the time He was born in Bethlehem, king Herod sought to kill Him. As He grew, He could say, "Many a time have they afflicted Me from my youth up ..." (Psalm 129:1,2)

His own synagogue of about 30 years responded to His gracious claims and convicting truths "with great wrath, and rose up, and thrust Him out of the city, and led Him to the brow of a hill on which their city was built, that they might cast Him down headfirst." - (Luke 4:28,29)

His own brothers hurt him with cruel words, "for neither did His brethren believe in Him." (John 7:5)

Finally, the hatred of the religious leaders culminated in permission to crucify Jesus. But Pilate knew "that for envy they had delivered Him." (Matthew 27:18)

What quality of love it was that brought Him down to us when He knew what He would face!

The words of John sum it all up like this: "He was in the world, and the world was made by Him, and the world recognized Him not. He came unto His own, and His own received Him not.

But, to as many as received (lit: welcomed!) Him, to them gave He power (authority) to become the children of God, even to those who believe on His name." (John 1:10-12)

That same privilege is still available to every heart that will receive Jesus Christ today.

"Behold! What manner (quality!) of love the Father has bestowed upon us that we should be called the children of God!" (1 John 3:1)

"He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors."
(Isaiah 53:12)



Go and See - "Let us go now to Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass" - Luke 2:15

When the Wise Men from the East came to Jerusalem asking "Where is He that is born King of the Jews?" there was no rush of feet off to Bethlehem to see if it was true.

Isaiah agonized over this and wrote, "Lord, who has believed our report? ... He was

wounded for our transgressions and bruised for our iniquities" yet we have "hid our faces from Him." (Isaiah 53)

Why? Because we hide from truths we don't want to face. And it is this: sin is more serious than you or I want to admit. It's wages are death.
